Five things you can do for

ReBirth the Earth in the winter

1. Plan a tree planting for spring

Planting trees is not as easy as digging a hole in the ground and plopping a tree in it. You can start by finding the right location. Always check with the owner of the property to, first, make sure it is ok and to, second, make sure there are no gas, water or electric lines running under the spot you want to use. Next, go to local business to see if they will donate the number of trees you want to plant when the springtime comes.

2. Collect sponsorships for a tree planting

3. Educate others on the importance of planting trees

You cannot save the world all by yourself, get others to help out! Make sure that you tell as many people as you can about the harmful effect that burning fossil fuels has on our planet and that a great way to reduce that negative effect is to plant trees, which absorbs and stores green house gases such as CO2

4. Hold a fundraiser to raise money for ReBirth the Earth

Part of the ReBirth the Earth: Trees for Tomorrow Campaign is raising money to start five tree nurseries in Tanzania. If you cannot plant trees, then you can still get involved by raising some money! So, get out there and hold a bake sale or put out a change jar.
